

If the pattern has a double line around it, the seam allowances are included.

Note: By default, seam allowances are NOT included (single line) and will need to be added when laying out and cutting details.

Seam Allowance: 1 cm on all seams; hem guidelines are printed on pattern.

Important! Please print all the paper patterns and lay them out at the width of fabric you plan to use (usually from 90 to 150 cm) to see how much fabric you will need.

Don't forget to take into account pieces to be duplicated or cut on a fold. When sewing the garment, pay attention to notches. They must match up with corresponding pieces.

4237 Sweater with Cowl Neck

Recommendations on fabric: natural or mixed knit fabric of medium stretchiness.

CUTTING:

The word, "beam" used on some patterns means "straight of grain". Some pieces will be cut on the fold, this is noted on the pattern piece. Mark all notches and other design features such as darts, pleats etc. from the pattern onto your fabric.



Seam allowances: all seams 0.8 cm.

Main fabric:

1. Back part – 1 detail
2. Front part – 1 detail
3. Sleeve – 2 details
4. Collar – 1 detail
5. Lower placket – 1 detail
6. Cuff – 2 details

Advice: Knitted fabric details are sewn together with special elastic or narrow zig-zag stitch.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Advice: sew knit pieces with special elastic/zig-zag stitches. If you use an overlock, cut seam allowances to 0.6-0.8 cm width. Topstitch hem allowances with double needle to save elasticity.

1. Sew shoulder and side seams of the back and front. Serge and press towards the back.
2. Sew sleeve seam. Serge and press. Sew cuff into a ring, fold in half lengthwise, and attach to the sleeve. Serge. Sew sleeve into armhole, matching notches. Serge and press.
3. Sew placket into a ring, fold in half lengthwise, and attach to the hem of the garment. Serge.
4. Sew collar into a ring, turn right side out, and press. Fold collar in half, wrong sides together. Attach collar to neckline, matching notches (collar seam positioned near the left shoulder seam). Serge collar seam and press.
