

If the pattern has a double line around it, the seam allowances are included.

**Note:** By default, seam allowances are NOT included (single line) and will need to be added when laying out and cutting details.

Seam Allowance: 1 cm on all seams; hem guidelines are printed on pattern.

**Important!** Please print all the paper patterns and lay them out at the width of fabric you plan to use (usually from 90 to 150 cm) to see how much fabric you will need.

Don't forget to take into account pieces to be duplicated or cut on a fold. When sewing the garment, pay attention to notches. They must match up with corresponding pieces.

## 5715 Fleece Poncho with Fringes

Recommendations on fabric: fleece.

You will also need: lining, fusible interfacing, zipper.

### CUTTING:

The word, "beam" used on some patterns means "straight of grain". Some pieces will be cut on the fold, this is noted on the pattern piece. Mark all notches and other design features such as darts, pleats etc. from the pattern onto your fabric.

Seam allowances: all seams 1 cm.

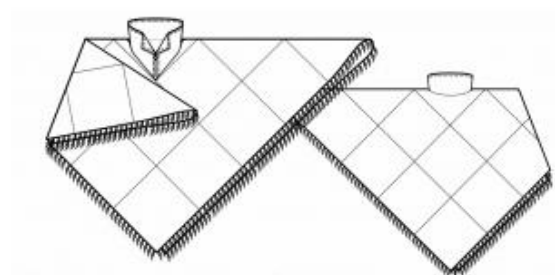
### Main fabric:

1. Square – cut 25
2. Collar – cut 1

### Lining:

1. Poncho – cut 1

Fusible interfacing: Collar – cut 1



## INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Apply fusible interfacing to the wrong side of the collar.
2. Fold the collar along the center, wrong side out. Place the zipper between the short edges with the zipper teeth inside, then sew. Turn the collar right side out and press. Make decorative stitching along the upper edge of the collar beside the zipper.
3. Sew the squares together according to the overall shape of the poncho. Press seam allowances open.
4. Mark the neckline on the center square. Cut an opening, leaving a 1 cm seam allowance for attaching the collar. Baste the collar into the neckline.
5. Mark the neckline on the lining. Cut an opening, leaving a 1 cm seam allowance for attaching the collar. Pin the garment to the lining, right sides together, and sew the neckline, stitching in the collar. Clip into curves. Sew around the perimeter of the poncho, leaving an opening in one side for turning it right side out. Trim the corners, turn the poncho right side out, sew the opening closed, and press. Make decorative stitching along the edges.
